GENERAL INFORMATION**

HEALTH FORMS/ SPECIAL ACTIVITY RESTRICTIONS/ PERSONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS: The Big Bear Sports Ranch must have these 3 forms completed, signed and returned to our offices one (1) month prior to arrival.

CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT: Check-in time is between 10:30 am-12:30 pm on Sunday. During this time we are proud to offer a "BEARS EYE" view of what our program, staff and facilities are all about. A complimentary lunch for campers and their families will follow check-in around 12:00pm.

CLOSING CEREMONIES: An awards ceremony will begin at 10:00 am on Saturday. Parents are invited and encouraged to attend. Checkout and departure will immediately follow.

TRANSPORTATION: It is the responsibility of all parents/guardians to arrange the delivery and pick-up of all campers. For campers who live out of the area, we also offer **AIRPORT PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF TO ONTARIO AIRPORT ONLY**. There is an additional charge for all transportation services. (\$100 for airport roundtrip pick-up and drop-off.)

MULTI-WEEK STAY-OVER CAMPERS: There is no additional charge for the "extra" day at camp for multi-week stay-over campers. Typically, no formal instruction/programs are scheduled for Saturdays, and we encourage this as a rest period for campers. However, staff supervised recreational activities including the Waterslide, Alpine Slide, Bowling and Movie night etc... may be available for all stay-over campers. Laundry service is available at no additional charge for our multi-week campers.

HEALTH AND SAFETY: The Big Bear Valley Community Hospital is ten minutes from the ranch with emergency room service available 24 hours a day.

CAMPER ACCOUNT-SPENDING MONEY: All basic costs for items such as instruction, room and board, and on-site activities are included in each camper's tuition. In addition, the Big Bear Sports Ranch offers several "optional" off-site activities as well as an on-site camp store. Fees for items and activities vary, and most campers like to partake in these extra activities, etc. An "average" camper may spend \$75-\$100 per week. This usually **does NOT cover** transportation costs, so additional funds should be provided for transportation. We do not allow campers to **KEEP** monies in their personal possession during camp, so any transportation and camper spending monies must be deposited with the BBSR camp "bank." These funds may be added (sent with) your final payment or deposited with our staff during Sunday check-in. At the end of each camper's stay, expenses will be deducted from the camper's account and any remaining balance will be refunded as a check to the parents/guardian of the camper.

BALANCE OF PAYMENTS: Tuition balance is due by June 1. Credit card authorized payments will be automatically billed on this date. You may wish to include funds for your camper's "bank" (camper account) with your final payment. Any funds received above your "tuition due" will be credited to the camper account and refunded accordingly. Paypal does not release credit card info to the Big Bear Sports Ranch so if your deposit was paid through paypal your credit card will not be automatically charged.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Prior to June 1st, a Full Refund will be given less a \$50.00 service fee retained by the BBSR. Cancellations after June 1st but prior to 2 weeks before your camp session begins will receive a full refund less their \$300 deposit. No CASH refund will be given for any cancellations made within 2 weeks of the beginning of their camp session. The monies spent on the registration will become credit that can be applied to any session for the current year (per space being available) or the following years camp. This credit is transferable to other family members (siblings, cousins etc.) . Special exceptions can be made at the discretion of the BBSR Management and will be on a CASE BY CASE basis.

CELL PHONES: For obvious reasons, we do not allow campers to keep cell phones in their possession during their stay at camp. Any camper that brings a private cell phone to camp **MUST** check the phone with our office and the use of such phone must be specified by parents and limited to times and conditions as deemed appropriate to coincide with the regular BBSR camp programs and schedules.

ROOMMATES AND HOUSING: Campers sleep in bunk beds in mountain style cabins. Housing areas (rooms) vary in size, ranging from 4-12 beds per area. Camper will be housed with others of the same sex and similar age. Every attempt will be made to honor roommate requests; however, remember camp is a *great place to make NEW friends!*

CAMP "CARE" PACKAGES: We maintain a BBSR rule of not allowing junk-food in camp. Please do not send food and/or candy, etc because it will be confiscated. However, we do recommend friends and family send campers mail (letters, postcards etc.) and "care" packages. This gives children an overall complete camping experience. We recommend the "SEALED WITH A KISS" camp packages and sending emails via the bunk1.com Web-Site.

THINGS TO BRING TO CAMP: The following list provides you a list of items each camper should bring to camp. The daily temperature has a wide range-- from the high 50's at night to the high 80's during the day - so prepare to dress accordingly.

Clothing Items:

- 6 shirts, 6 shorts/skirts, 6-8 pairs socks
- 6-8 pair of underwear, 1 set of pajamas
- Sweater, sweatshirt, warm jacket/warm-up suit
- Bathing suit, beach towel
- 1-2 pair sneakers, sandals/shower shoes
- 2 pairs of long pants
- Hat (visor), sunglasses
- dressy outfit for evening activities
- Sports Equipment*

Personal Items:

- Toiletries, personal items, hair dryer
- Laundry bag,
- Sleeping bag, pillow case & towel (required)
- Stationary, stamps, addresses, pen, pencil
- Water bottle/jug, sun block, lotion, chap stick
- Flash light & padlock (optional)

PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL PERSONAL ITEMS AND EQUIPMENT ARE MARKED WITH CAMPER'S NAME.

***SPORTS EQUIPMENT:** Each child is required to bring their own specific sports equipment as it applies to their main sport. This would include items such as: roller blades and relative padding etc., tennis rackets, soccer shoes and/or other item as may seem appropriate. The BBSR also has a limited supply of additional recreational sporting equipment on-site that may be used during "cross-over" sport activity.

LAUNDRY & LOST AND FOUND: Campers should bring fresh clothing for one week. Our free on-site laundry facilities are only available on weekends for multi-week campers. Lost and Found items will only be sent back on request by parents--- C.O.D. We recommend leaving electronic items (such as iPods) at home.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. USE OF DRUGS, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC DISMISSAL. All tuition fees will be forfeited and parents shall pick up their child immediately.
 2. All campers shall respect other campers, the staff and the property of the BBSR. At no time shall a camper deface any cabin walls, bunks or camp property. Campers are responsible for any damage to the BBSR property as well as the property of the staff and other campers.
 3. At no time may a camper leave camp without permission of the Director or Head Counselor.
 4. If a camper feels sick at any time, he or she should see a counselor at once.
 5. All campers are to be present in their cabins at bedtime. (approx. 10 pm nightly)
 6. Campers shall refrain from making noise after the "lights out".
 7. Campers shall be prompt in attending all required meetings, lessons, matches and special duties.
 8. We expect all campers to give their fullest attention to all drills and lessons.
 9. Campers should line up for their meals in a quiet and orderly fashion. They must wear shirts and shoes in the dining area as swim attire is not acceptable.
 10. Cabins shall be neat and clean at all times with inspection conducted daily.
 11. Campers shall not have in their possession any candy, gum, junk food or sodas. Any of these type of items found will be disposed of by the BBSR staff.
 12. All lost or stolen items are the responsibility of their owner and not the BBSR.
 13. Any camper with continued disregard for the camp rules will be asked to leave without refund. A parent or guardian will be responsible for picking up their child at the earliest possible time.
 14. Outside telephone calls shall be kept to a minimum. Use of the office phone is restricted for "approved" calls only.

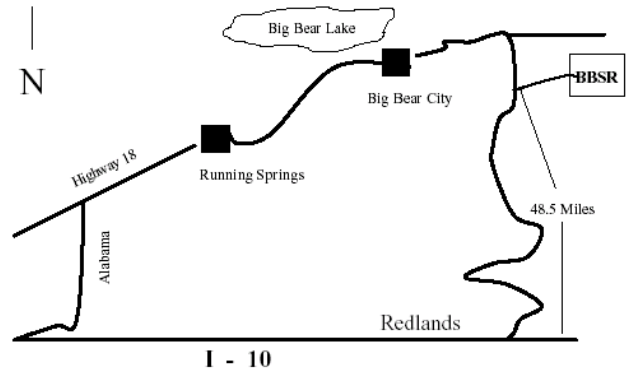

From Los Angeles/Orange county area.

- Get to the 10 freeway and take it East
- Get off on University blvd. in Redlands
- Take a left at the stop sign and go about 1.5 miles to Lugonia (which turns into Highway 38) and take a right
- Stay on this road for about 50 miles
- Once you seem to be going down the backside of the mountain into the Bear valley and you see houses on both sides of the road look for a State Lane/Mitchell road sign (DO NOT TURN YET)
- This is a signal to slow down and look for our sign ½ mile ahead on the right
- Turn in and bear left down the road
- Turn right at the flags into our parking lot

- Take the 10 freeway West
- Get off on Oak Glen blvd near Yuciapa and take a right at stop sign
- Go about 6 miles to Bryant - Take left
- Go about 2 miles to stop sign -Take a right. This is highway 38
